MICHAEL CARASTINOS, RESIDENT THE BOSTON HOME, RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED SCOUTING AWARD

Dorchester, Mass.--Michael Carastinos, a resident of The Boston Home in Dorchester, recently received the Norman A. Norton Award for Scouting for his long-standing work with the Boy Scouts of America. He was presented the award at The Boston Home before his family, friends, and former boy scouts of his troop, which had met for many years at the Sacred Heart Church in Malden.

Carastinos who has been involved in the boy scouts for over 25 years, has received several additional awards, including the Silver Beaver Award, The Distinguished Service Award, The St. George Award for Catholic Scouting, the District Award of Merit, and the Distinguished Scout Master Award.
