GIRL SCOUT TROOP HELPS RESIDENTS AT THE BOSTON HOME, DONATES 500 VIDEOS TO THE DORCHESTER FACILITY

Dorchester, Mass.— The Boston Home in Dorchester, a long-term care facility for adults with physical disabilities, primarily multiple sclerosis and related neurological diseases, recently received almost 500 videotapes from Girl Scout Troop #4605 of Dedham. The scouts and their leader, Karen Hickey, presented the donation to residents at The Boston Home.

The troop began its project in December 2002 by arranging for local residents to drop off videos at schools, stores, their local library, and video outlets. The Dedham school system helped by asking parents and children to donate videos. The girl scouts then collected the videos, chronicled them by categories, and visited The Boston Home to present their extensive video library.

“We very much appreciate the hard work and good will of these girl scouts,” said Marva Serotkin, CEO of The Boston Home. “Our residents now have quite a collection of videotapes to choose from, and they are enjoying this generous donation.”

The Boston Home, founded in 1881, is a not-for-profit, 84-bed, long-term care facility located on Dorchester Ave. in Dorchester. It is one of just a few such facilities in the country.
