TWO FROM THE BOSTON HOME RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS FROM THE MECF

Dorchester, Mass. – Judy Bellevue and M. Olava Cardoso, nursing professionals from The Boston Home in Dorchester—a long-term care facility for adults with physical disabilities, primarily multiple sclerosis and related neurological diseases—have received Massachusetts Extended Care Federation (MECF) Scholarship Awards.

Bellevue is an L.P.N. Charge Nurse who has been with The Boston Home for 13 years. She is pursuing her R.N. at Curry College in Milton, Mass.

Cardoso, a Senior Certified Nurse Aide with 11 years at The Boston Home, was recently awarded her L.P.N. degree from Roxbury Community College and is pursuing her R.N. degree.

“We are committed to partnering with our staff as they progress in their healthcare careers, and we are grateful to MECF for supporting our employees,” said Mark Williamson, Director of Human Services at The Boston Home.

Since its inception in 1987, MECF, based in Newton, has awarded over \$1.5 million in scholarships to nearly 800 individuals, nearly half of whom were in entry-level positions in long-term care.
