DAVID YOUNG-HONG JOINS THE BOSTON HOME AS REHABILITATION PROGRAM MANAGER

Dorchester, Mass.—David Young-Hong recently joined The Boston Home in Dorchester as the Rehabilitation Program Manager. The Boston Home is a long-term care facility for adults with physical disabilities, primarily multiple sclerosis and related neurological diseases. Hong joined The Boston Home through a special arrangement with Easter Seals of Massachusetts, supporting its mission to help individuals with disabilities expand their independence.

Hong oversees TBH's Rehabilitation Department and serves as the liaison with nursing and related programs to promote the continuity of care for the residents.

Hong graduated from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, Canada as an occupational therapist. He then worked as a therapist in Mississippi and Tennessee before he accepted a position in Medford, Mass. in the outpatient brain injury/neurology program. In March 2003 he joined the Easter Seals of Massachusetts as a Rehabilitation Program Manager in the Contract Services department.

Easter Seals helps people with disabilities expand their independence. It responds to unmet needs through assistive technology services, accessible job training and employment programs, inclusive recreational activities, rehabilitation services, and public awareness programs.

The Boston Home, founded in 1881, is a not-for-profit, 84-bed, long-term care facility located on Dorchester Ave. in Dorchester. It is one of just a few such facilities in the country.

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
